How do Friends meet our responsibilities to the community and the world?

Social & Economic Justice

Queries:

- Do we seek to transform the world with our loving spirit?
- Do we take an active interest in the social and economic conditions of our community?
- Have we objectively considered the causes of discrimination, and are we ready to abandon old prejudices and think anew?
- Do we as individuals and as a meeting do all in our power to end governmental, social, economic, and educational injustices in our community and to create equal opportunity for all?
- How do we as individuals and as a meeting promote the welfare of those in need and work to secure a just distribution of the world's resources?
- What are we doing as individuals and as a meeting to understand and remove the causes of war and violence and to develop the conditions and institutions of peace?

Advices:

- Seek to understand the causes of social ills, and work toward their removal.
- Be not content to accept things as they are, but keep an alert, sensitive, and questioning mind.
- Understand and maintain Friends' witness for truth, simplicity, and nonviolence, holding up your personal life to these testimonies.
- Encourage inclusiveness, and discourage discrimination.
- Friends' belief in that of God in everyone should lead to reverence for all life and to personal integrity.
- Encourage all efforts to overcome prejudices and antagonisms.
- Cherish diversity.
- Aid and comfort those afflicted or in prison that they may rebuild their lives.
- Work for the abolition of the death penalty.
- Let the way that we live contribute to the realization of a peaceable kingdom on earth.

MINUTES OF THE FORT MYERS MONTHLY MEETING OF THE RELIGIOUS SOCIETY OF FRIENDS 10th Month 9, 2016

The Fort Myers Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends met in Iona House on tenth month 9, with 14 Friends present. The meeting opened with silent worship. Out of the silence, Clerk Nancy Fennell broke the silence by reading advices and queries on the subject of Social and Economic Justice. One Friend noted that it was timely that these queries came at a time coincidental with our considering our future role with the Lee Interfaith for Empowerment (L.I.F.E.) organization.

Ministry and Counsel Committee: Clerk Richard Frechette informed Friends that the Committee considered a request of one Friend that it address the matter of individuals during or at the rise of meeting asking the meeting for emergency financial assistance. The response the last few times had been a "passing of the hat." The Committee wishes to recommend a future process and presents a draft minute for Friends to consider. In response, one friend suggested that we have on hand grocery market gift cards that could be available to meet an occasional emergency need. We discussed a particular case that occurred this year, and M&C responded that one of the committee will take steps to try to reach out to this individual. Friends approved the following minute:

MINUTE 16MM12: When an individual or group during or at rise of meeting requests emergency financial assistance, the meeting will not take immediate action such as passing the hat. Rather, a member of M&C will inform the individual(s) that members of the Committee will discuss the matter with him/her after meeting. M&C will take appropriate action, if needed.

Clerk's Report: Nancy Fennell read and spoke about the Spiritual State of the Meeting report from Tallahassee. "We seek to stay open to God's guidance in dealing with our challenges, which will further strengthen our community and witness to the wider world." "Meeting teaches us to make room for those different from ourselves, to listen to and sit with challenging statements, yet continue to experience the inclusion of us all." "Many of us who travel or have a wide range of life responsibilities must periodically miss Meeting for Worship, sometimes for several weeks, but find experience of meeting an anchor as we seek times of guiet when we are awav."

The Clerk also announced that SEYM has hired Beverly Ward, a member of Tampa Meeting, as its Secretary for Earthcare Witness.

Properties Committee: Clerk Mary Smiley informed Friends that the Committee would be planning a work session for after the Nature Center's Haunted Walk.

Outreach Committee: The new website is under construction and progressing well. Having started the food collection program since last month, over 27 pounds of food was brought to the Harry Chapin Food Bank. We discussed whether it would be better for us to donate money vs non-perishable foods. One Friend thought that doing both helps us to remain cognizant of the needs of our larger community.

Religious Education: Nancy Fennell will lead a workshop on November 20 on the Unwritten "Rules" of Meeting for Worship

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer John Battin distributed and spoke to our financial condition for the period ended September 30, 2016, which is shown here. John asked committees to send in their 2017 budget requests to the Finance Committee within the next month.

Calusa Nature Center:

Joan Culver reported that the recent Return to Nature fundraising activity was considered successful. It took about 90 days to prepare. Currently CNCP is conducting the Friendly Forest, and at the end of October will be the Haunted Walk. An Office Manager and Education Coordinator have yet to be hired, as well as an Executive Director (the Board chair is still serving as acting Executive Director). We briefly discussed whether our current level of monetary and time support to the CNCP effort is optimal.

The minutes of the meeting were read and approved. We ended the meeting in centered silence.



A Sustainable Life: Quaker Faith and Practice in the Renewal of Creation by Douglas Gwyn

A well-known Quaker historian explores the qualities of Quaker faith and practice that contribute to living sustainably in the world today. He explores such paradoxes as equality and community, unity and differentiation, integrity and personal discernment, and other aspects of life that Quakers have worked to bring into balance through their 350-year history. How have Quakers learned to create the kind of individual and community life that can prepare us to live fully and responsibly into a time of social and planetary change?
