MINUTES OF THE FORT MYERS MONTHLY MEETING OF THE RELIGIOUS SOCIETY OF FRIENDS 6th Month 9, 2019

The Fort Myers Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends met in Iona House on 6th month 9th day with Friends 16 present. The meeting opened with a period of silent centering on the topic of Home, Family, and Relationships.

Advices: Clerk Joan Culver read two advices from SEYM <u>Faith and Practice</u> for the Meeting's reflection:

*Remember the value of beauty in all its forms. *God's gifts are for all to enjoy; learn to use them wisely.

<u>Clerk's Report</u>: Clerk Joan Culver reminded the Meeting that we do not meet as a Meeting for Business in July and August but will resume in September. Committees may meet if they choose. Joan requests that in the fall, Committee chairs send committee reports to the Clerk and to the Recording Clerk so that Minutes can have some level of formatting created prior to the Meeting for Business.

<u>Ministry and Council Committee</u>: Ministry and Counsel has nothing to bring to the Meeting at this time.

Finance Committee. The Finance Committee asks the Meeting to insert \$631.32 into the 2019 budget to pay for the second year (2019) of a contract for the Meeting telephone. It is currently a second line on Joan Culver's personal phone. This was approved in 2018 as a "free first year" line with \$631.32 coming up in the second year. However, for a number of reasons, we neglected to get this into the budget for the 2019 year. We propose that the Outreach Committee budget would be an appropriate place to designate these funds so we would increase Outreach's budget by the same 631.32. The Outreach Committee has approved this change.

Following some discussion of costs and uses of the phone, the following minute was passed:

Minute 2019-MM10. Fort Myers Monthly meeting agrees to increase the 2019 budget by \$631.32 to cover the cost of the Meeting phone. The funds will be designated to the budget of the Outreach Committee.

<u>Adult Religious Education.</u> Roxy Jacobs reported that the committee in preparation for worship-sharing workshop would like to order several copies of "Four Doors to Meeting for Worship" by William Taber. Friends agreed.

<u>Peace and Social Concerns Committee</u>. Clerk Carolyn Stanley reported that The Peace Day Working Group met on Monday, June 3 to plan for the Southwest Florida Peace Day celebration at the Alliance for the Arts in Fort Myers. At a later date, they will present final plans to the Meeting for Business and invite Friends to sign up to help host the booth for 2 hours or visit during the day Sunday, Sept. 22 from 10am until 6pm.

Discussion followed regarding ways of raising awareness of gun violence issues.

Carolyn reported that Misión Peniel is in need of volunteers this Friday, June 14 and every Friday throughout the summer. It was suggested that people interested call in advance to 386-793-6151. People are available to translate [if needed] for volunteers who don't speak Spanish or French.

Connie Summerlin reported data for the FMMM's contributions to The Harry Chapin Food Bank.

Jim Koopman reported that the Environmental action group invites and welcomes participation by any Friends interested.

Hospitality Committee. Clerk Deb White asked for feedback on the best way to control the air conditioning problem during Meeting, since the room is uncomfortable in summer without AC running, but with AC it is hard to hear. Suggestions followed, including providing hand fans. Clerk Joan Culver reminded everyone that Deb is in charge of managing the air conditioning, so Friends should see her with any concerns or suggestions.

Outreach Committee: Outreach Committee has no report.

Properties: Properties Committee has no report.

Library Committee: Susan Oehl reported that the library needs attention in terms of decisions about repair, clearing, and organizing. She plans to select a book to highlight and place it on the table each week.

Calusa Nature Center: Joan Culver said that she has been serving the CNCP on the Board of Trustees, on the Executive Board, and as Secretary of the Executive Board ; she has recently resigned her Executive Board secretary position. Quakers have a designated place on the general Board which meets 3 times a year.

New Business: There was no new business introduced. Friends, especially clerks of committees, were reminded to contact the Clerk before Meeting for Business when they want to suggest a topic for the Agenda, or a report of a committee, or a Minute proposed by their committee.

The minutes of today's meeting were read and approved. We closed in silent worship.

A Guide To Listening And Speaking In Our Quaker Meeting For Worship

One can expect silence to prevail during most of the Meeting. However, one or more persons may feel moved by the Spirit to offer vocal ministry. Usually, these messages are spiritual in nature and are not preplanned. It is helpful to rise and speak clearly so that everyone may hear.

It is well to remember that spoken messages should not outrun the spiritual guide which moved them. Simple, direct, and brief messages are valued. It is customary to speak no more than once during a Meeting

Allowing a period of silence after messages gives time to reflect on the previous message and the opportunity for further messages to emerge.
