- Do we act responsibly concerning substances and behaviors that can become addictive?

Advices:

- Take heed, dear Friends, to the promptings of love and truth in our hearts, which are the leadings of God.
- Bring the whole of our life under the healing and ordering of the Holy Spirit, remembering that there is no time but this present.
- When tempted to do wrong or to despair, call upon God with an open heart, confessing our weaknesses and our needs.
- Be mindful at all times of our connection with the Divine and others—avoid substances, behaviors, and activities which diminish this connection.

- Be aware of the ill effects of mind-altering or habit-forming drugs, intoxicants, gambling, and other detrimental practices.
- Choose recreations that increase our vitality, self awareness, and peace of mind and strengthen our will to create what is good.
- Make thoughtful use of our time.
- Guard ourselves and our children in our choice of print, electronic media, and other entertainments. Avoid those that promote violence and disrespect for human beings.

Report from Religious Education Committee

Dear F/friends,

Greetings. This little document will serve as both minutes from the last meeting of the Religious Education Committee and a draft toward our report with recommendations to Ft. Myers Monthly Meeting, for your review and improvement.

We met July 3 at 9 AM until about ten thirty, with the following proposals to recommend to the Meeting:

Recommendations on process for Quakerism 101

- 1. That the Meeting support seven sessions for Quakerism 101, drawing from our work over some months and around the world to seek suitable approaches and materials for our needs to recommend to the Meeting;
- 2. That the first session be worshipful consideration of J. Brent Brill's book Holy Silence, to be ordered in July for Friends to read and consider over the summer for personal practice and in preparation for our first session together;
- 3. That our Quakerism 101 sessions be held on the third Sunday of each month from October 2021 through April 2022 at 12:30 for approximately one hour, having given up our earlier idea of 9 A.M. as crowded;
- 4. That each session be preceded by providing the full membership with written materials drawn from our diligent search of many available resources;
- 5. That the sessions themselves be conducted in the manner of Meeting for Worship, with an introductory set of remarks by one of rotating members of the Religious Education Committee followed by contributions, questions, discussion (with cross-talk to be allowed, even encouraged).
- 6. That all members and attenders be invited to participate, and invited to tell us whether they plan to attend, and by what modality, so we know how to arrange setup for how many.
- 7. That we order a copy of the current SEYM Faith and Practice for each participant, timed for our beginning session both as a possible reference aid during our sessions and as a gift to those who join us.

As Friends in Melbourne Meeting have written,

"We have no dogma, no creed, no preachers, no sacraments. We believe in the Light Within, 'That of God in everyone,' upon which our Testimonies of Simplicity, 2021strive to witness to the world in our daily lives. Join us in the immediacy of a shared spiritual experience."

- 4. **January 16, 2022.** The Inner Light, division of Friends, modern beliefs and actions, leadership in peace, racial concerns, and other matters. Led by Tom Miller. Background materials from Melbourne Meeting, pages 7 15, and Durham Meeting, pages 7 15.
- 5. **February 20, 2022** Interests, Challenges, and Contemporary Issues for Friends Ranging from Spirituality to Racial Concerns to the Environment and others. Led by Nancy Howell, Susan Oehl and Religious Education Committee members. Background materials from Berkeley Friends and others.
- 6. **March 20, 2022.** Southeastern Yearly Meeting Faith and Practice. Led by Donna Anderton and Religious Education Committee members.
- 7. Brief Evaluation of this Quakerism 101 and Looking to the Future: Quakerism 101 participants.

The Pot Luck Lunches Have Returned!


Friends have been able to get around the Covid restrictions regarding worship by instituting Zoom worship, then hybrid Zoom & in-person worship. But many have shared their sadness about not having our traditional community building activities. But, as of



earlier this month we reinstituted the pot luck lunch. The lunch was held at and around the chickee hut in Buckingham, and will continue to be held there on the first 1st day of each month following worship until we relocate the physical worship gathering. It's not quite what we had in the past. It doesn't serve those who are connected to worship via Zoom only. And it is dependent on decent weather. But it's a big step back to a full sense of community.
