# Fort Myers Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends Meeting for Worship with Attention to Business 9th Month 10, 2023

The Fort Myers Monthly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends met for Business in hybrid format on 9<sup>th</sup> month, 10<sup>th</sup> day with 11 Friends present. The Meeting opened with a period of silent centering. Clerk Richard Frechette read from SEYM's Queries & Advices, 9<sup>th</sup> month:

- To what extent is our personal life in accord with Quaker Principles?
- Is our Quaker witness characterized by humility and a willingness to learn from others?
- Do we recognize that the Spirit works in the world through us?
- Do we as a Meeting try to share in the religious life of our wider community, availing ourselves of opportunities for worship and service with other local religious groups?

Among the thoughts expressed in response were:

- As our community looks toward physically sharing grounds with the Unitarians and other groups we will become a community with other like-minded people, which will not only enrich ourselves, but allow us to share our witness in ways we haven't been able to in the past.
- I've been moved by the advice that the spirit moves through us: when we reach out to others, we are building ties, strengthening both ourselves and others. Our new Meetinghouse will not be just a new building, but a new opportunity for community.
- I live on a block with six or seven other churches, but I have never visited them. I should start with the first one, the Presbyterians, and find out what they're about.

#### Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Paul Davis reported that most of our expenses this month are for the architect and engineers who are working on permitting and getting drawings ready for our contractor. The Meeting is in good shape this year; we have now met all our commitments to others. Friend Paul reminded us to send checks for the General Fund to Friend Denise Runyon and to himself for the Meetinghouse Fund.

Our total funds are kept in an interest-bearing account, but not in Friends Fiduciary, since they need to be fairly liquid. We're earning about \$1000 a month interest. The Meeting should be getting a gift from Friend Donna Anderson's will, which is not yet settled.

Friend Paul reminded us that we will receive a grant for our handicapped access ramp once the new building is being constructed.

#### Meetinghouse Committee Report

Friend Helen Fox reported: At our last meeting, the committee laid out a timeline for the architect and engineers to follow this summer, including applying for permits, creating final architectural plans, and sharing them with our contractor and the Unitarians. In general, the work has been proceeding as planned and we are on track for groundbreaking in November 2023.

Construction has been going on next door at a "luxury storage condo facility." A large retention pond has been dug, and two elevated mounds have been placed where the buildings will be. The engineers are the same for our project and theirs, so we are confident that the drainage next door is being engineered properly and we will not suffer any damage.

**Other Business**: Since there seems to be a renewed interest in music before or after worship the Meeting asks Nominating Committee to consider establishing a music committee.

There being no other business, the Meeting ended with silence at 12:41pm.

Below is SEYM's introduction to the concept and format of Spiritual Formation Program.

The work of Spiritual Formation Programs is accomplished within a small group format. These groups have been referred to as "circles of trust," "circles of light," "friendship circles," "spiritual companion groups," etc. SEYM prefers to call the small groups "spiritual companion groups."


The primary goal of a spiritual formation program is to deepen one's relationship with the Divine, God, Spirit, or Inner Light through four major avenues: reading

devotionally, individual spiritual practice, deep listening and spiritual community. Walking the spiritual path along with others in the group tends to lead to the formation of meaningful and long-lasting relationships. The transformative work of spiritual formation inevitably contributes to the spiritual wellbeing of the individual, the monthly and yearly meetings.

Spiritual Formation Programs have a long and respected history among many religious groups, including the Religious Society of Friends. Both Philadelphia and Baltimore Yearly Meetings have collaborated and published their entire programs on the web in order to serve as models for others. Many yearly meetings in the United States have adapted these models to meet the particular needs of their constituent meetings.
