Religious Education Report

The Religious Education Committee met May 9, 2024 to review the recent 3-part worship-sharing series based on Holding One Another in the Light by Marcelle Martin; and to consider future programs.

The committee was in unity that the worship sharing series was valuable and well received by the FMMM community. It seems to have been timely given that a number of us are dealing with health challenges. The question was asked if these needs are opening the way for perhaps more attention to healing in some way, for example a Meeting for Healing, or a community-wide Healing Prayer Circle.

Other suggestions were offered for consideration and we welcome feedback from the meeting community about these:

- 1. Perhaps schedule the worship sharing in a way that we would meet weekly,
 - possibly all on zoom on a day and time separate from Meeting for Worship.
 - meet before Meeting for Worship.
- 2. Plan a Worship Sharing in Fall 2025, based on a pamphlet. The committee is open to suggestions for the pamphlet. "Four Doors to Meeting for Worship" by William Taber was suggested in our Committee.
- 3. Have a Day-Long Retreat, in coordination with other committees (M&C, P&SC), perhaps in Winter 2025 when we are at our fullest attendance.
- 4. Participate in larger Friends' programs as a community. In this way, we do not have to create the whole program on our own, and the Meeting deepens from this

shared experience.

- planning as a community to participate in a spiritual deepening e-retreat (online) offered by Friends General Conference (FGC).
- for more of us to attend the SEYM yearly meeting (in spring 2025).

An Opportunity to Create a Friends Microschool with the Unitarian Universalists

In a synchronistic flow of events "way has opened" for the FMMM to partner with the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Fort Myers (on Shire Rd. - the site for our future Meeting House) to develop a Friends School in the form of a microschool. A microschool is a small private non-traditional school, often with multiple grades in a classroom, that is not controlled by the state of Florida Department of Education, but is eligible to receive tuition grants from the state of Florida that can go toward tuition costs.

Two streams converged for this opportunity. 1) Suzanne Frechette has been meeting with the SEYM Call Committee who are exploring the concept of developing a Friends Microschool in Florida, probably in the Tampa area. This committee has been working on this for a few months and made contact with the Friends Council on Education and Friends Schools for resources.

2) Suzanne received a message from Reverend Sue Gabrielson, UU Congregation about the possibility of having a Friends School on their campus. They are looking at how to better utilize their buildings to serve the community. Reverend Sue was the director of a Friends School in Monteverde, Costa Rica before coming here full time. The UU campus has the physical classroom space (up to code

for schools) and outdoor space, interest from teachers, and a local daycare that is bringing a PreK program to their campus.

With all these logistics in place it seems to be a fabulous opportunity to consider having a Friends School under the guidance of the FMMM on the campus of the Unitarian Universalists.

Suzanne and Denise met with Reverend Gabrielson and Debbie Dunlap (member of UU congregation with Montessori teaching experience) on Saturday June 8, to consider how to proceed. It was a productive meeting. All agreed it should start small, probably with the early grades, K, 1,2,3, and possibly 4.

We wish to engage the FMMM community in discussion about our support for this project. Do Friends wish to continue with the development of a Friends School at the UU campus? Would we commit to providing Board Members and taking it under the guidance of the FMMM?

- Contact Quaker Peace Teams (The Meeting makes contributions to this Quaker organization.)
- Try to learn more about the Karen people.

In other business:

Chris McBride volunteered to contact candidate Kari Lerner to encourage her to attend and/or have a booth at the upcoming Juneteenth celebration which will be held on June 15th at Roberto Clemente Park in Fort Myers.

We thanked Richard for submitting the editorial of our Peace statement to the News Press which was published in a recent Sunday editions in Fort Myers and Naples.

LIFE members are encouraged to attend the next Fort Myers City Council Meeting on Monday, June 17 at 4:20 PM as we continue to work for affordable housing justice in Lee County. A few volunteers will speak about the need for the city to support the not for profit Housing Authority so that they can move forward on new affordable housing in Fort Myers. Those who attend to support the speakers are encouraged to wear red.
